### Knowledge Event - Health System and Community Resilience: Lessons From The COVID-19 Pandemic

We promote knowledge transfer experience sharing and learning on the preparedness, readiness & responses on health systems in the COVID-19 pandemic and the lessons learnt for health system resilience.

The COVID-19 pandemic has caused an unprecedented crisis with a protracted and unpredictable course even in countries with preparedness and response plans. Health systems were overwhelmed and were unable to adapt and absorb the demand and face challenges in their capacity to provide essential health functions. The recovery phase of the pandemic, presents an opportunity to synthesize the lessons learnt in country responses to inform policies for health system resilience for the next public health threat.

The Knowledge Event will comprise presentations by key policy decision makers and academics working in the pandemic responses from countries and jurisdictions in the Asia-Pacific Region on (i) how they collaborated with their community to prepare, respond, mitigate, adapt in the public health threat, (ii) the lessons learnt in transforming their health systems and (iii) strategies for institutionalizing the knowledge gained for health system and community resilience.

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## About the Events

### **5-7 December 2023**

We are pleased to announce a policy course on **Health System Transformation: Private Sector Engagement for Primary Care Led Integrated Health Care**.

The **3 days course from 5th to 7th December 2023** in Hong Kong is offered by the Asia-Pacific Network for Health Systems Strengthening (ANHSS) in Hong Kong. The collaborating local institution in the Centre for Health Systems and Policy Research of the JC School of Public Health and Primary Care, The Chinese University of Hong Kong. An **optional visit to an integrated primary care and hospital faculty** is planned on **8th December 2023** (Friday) subject to availability. The faculty for the course comprises senior academics and practitioners in health system and policy from seven Asia-Pacific jurisdictions.

The ageing of the global population is associated with a rising prevalence of chronic disease and preventable illness, generating escalating demands for health care and creating pressures on the sustainability of health systems. In the Asia Pacific Region non-communicable diseases accounts for more than 50% of mortality in every country. To address this impending threat to health systems, WHO has formulated a strategy on people-centered and integrated health services. Reorienting the model of healthcare which is comprehensive, focusing on prevention and with the foundations in primary and community care. Coordination of different types and levels of healthcare for integrated delivery is critical to meet the complex needs of people with chronic disease and for efficiency and effective healthcare.

In the Asia Pacific Region, fragmentation of health care service delivery is evident. Coordination of services within primary care, between primary community care and specialist hospital care is limited and problematic. Public and private healthcare systems effectively operate in segmented parallel systems which compromise effectiveness and efficiency of health systems. Countries have implemented policies to engage the private health sector for a transformed primary care led system. However significant challenges have impeded progress.

The course will provide an overview of the challenges encountered in the health system transformation to a primary care led integrated healthcare system in both tax and social insurance finance healthcare system. A framework for primary care led integrated system and mechanisms for co-ordination within primary care (horizontal integration), between primary-community care and specialist hospital care (vertical integration) will be discussed with course participants' input and applied in the context of their health systems. The course will cover the mechanisms for integrated care in the modalities of organisational, functional, professional, clinical and normative, and how they impact on the goal of access to coordinated, comprehensive and continuous care for patients and the population which meets their needs and expectations. Recognising health system as complex adaptive systems, the influence of the governance (policy) instruments in enabling or inhibiting the modalities of integration at the healthcare delivery and clinical levels will be discussed. The health system governance (policy) instruments of financing, strategic purchasing, contracting, regulation and information will be elaborated in depth in separate sessions. Case studies on countries experience of the 5 modalities and mechanisms for integration will be presented for learning. A final session will cover critical factors for implementation, approaches in monitoring and evaluation of policy interventions.

### **Objectives**

The course will provide participants with:

- Understanding of the challenges and issues confronting both tax and social insurance health systems in the transformation to a primary care-led integrated health system.
- Capacity in applying a framework and mechanisms for horizontal, vertical and temporal integration of the health care systems in the local context.
- Inform decisions in the choice of governance instruments in designing and implementing modalities and mechanisms for integration.
- Formulate implementation, monitoring and evaluation strategies for policy interventions.

### *Target Audience*

The primary target audience for the course are senior and mid-level policy makers at national and sub-national level, health policy implementer, health sector managers and practitioners working with the private sector and regulators. Heads/directors of private health care organization/ associations, academia and researchers in health services, system and policy, and global and international organizations/development partner representatives might also find this course useful.
